Reading Comprehension: Story "The Rabbit and the Lion":

Students should read the text "The Rabbit and the Lion" and answer questions about the following points in addition to other comprehension questions about the story.

1. Genre: Play. (Student should be able to write it correctly).

2. Author: Ed Vuong.

3. Illustrator: Tim Haggerty.

4. Characters: The Narrator, Rabbit and Lion.

Students will be provided with an **unseen passage** and they will answer comprehension questions related to the text.

- : The simple present is used to talk about:

Daily routines / habits. Actions that happen regularly.

-I wake up at 7 a.m.

-She drinks coffee every morning.

Spelling rules:

1. Most verbs: add -s

- work → works
- read → reads

2. Verbs ending in -ch, -sh, -s, -x, -z, -o: add -es

- watch → watches
- wash → washes
- kiss → kisses
- fix → fixes
- buzz → buzzes
- go → goes

Phonics: Long Vowel Pairs / More Long Vowel Pairs:

Student's Book: Pages. (75)(107)

English booklet pages : (32+33+34)

Long vowel sounds can be spelled with two vowels together making a pair. When two vowels are together, the first vowel says its name.

- The letters oa or oe usually have the long o sound.
- The letters ue or ui usually have the long u sound.
- The letters ai or ay usually have the long a sound.
- The letters ee or ea usually have the long e sound.
- The letters ie has the long i sound.

Writing: Routine: on Wednesday Dec. 3rd 2025
