- Choose an eye-catching title:
 - 1. Capitalize the first letter of each word in the title.
 - 2. Remember the title doesn't have a verb.
 - 3. Never use any punctuation marks in the title.
 - 4. You should write it in the middle of the first line.
 - 5. Keep it general and eye-catching.
- Add an interesting topic sentence at the beginning of your paragraph.
- 1. Leave a space before the your topic sentence. (Indentation)
- Include at least 3 details about the topic that you're writing about.
- Use lots of adjectives that draw pictures in readers' minds.
- End your paragraph with a proper conclusion.
- Use your best handwriting.
- Use accurate spelling.
- Use correct punctuation marks and avoid capitalization mistakes.
- Use appropriate tense.
