What is an informational text?

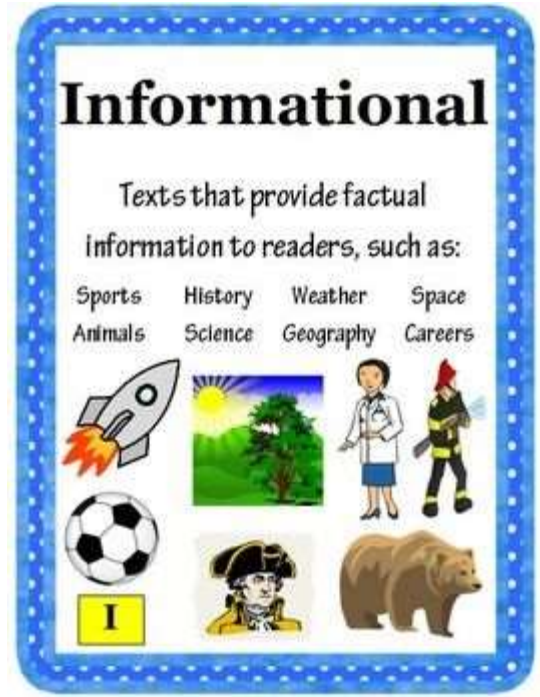
It is **nonfiction** writing, written with the intention of **informing** the reader about a specific topic.

- encyclopedias
- scholarly journals
- textbooks

Elements of informational text include:

- facts
- table of contents
- pictures
- captions
- bold print
- glossary
