leap (verb)	jump	The dog <b>leaped</b> over the gate into the field.

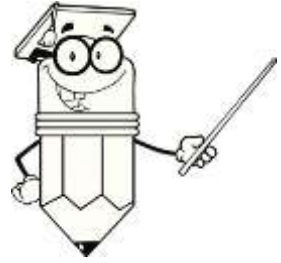
